WORKSHOP STREAMS

LEADERSHIP ESSENTIALS AND LEADING AS A TEAM

Ric McAlpine and Alex McClurg

Whether participants are new or experienced local executive officers or committee members, in this session, they will be challenged to hone their leadership skills and explore ways of building the power of the union.

This Winter School course offers modules covering:

Leadership Essentials:

Whom am I as a leader? Who are we as a local union? How do we fit into the broader movement? Learn how to use the power of your elected position to build power and strengthen solidarity in the union, in the labour movement and in our communities.

Leading as a Team

In this workshop, executive teams explore power and responsibility that comes with it, how we work in teams and how to balance our leadership styles to engage the membership and work effectively across diversity.



STEWARD LEARNING SERIES

Trish Sinclair and April McDonald

Calling all stewards! The Steward Learning Series is an exciting education program just for you. It provides an opportunity for stewards to explore a number of topics - all from a steward's point of view.

This Winter School presents the following modules from the Steward Learning Series:

Duty of Fair Representation

Learn about where stewards get their authority in the workplace, the duty of fair representation, and other labour laws that cover the workplace.

Handling Discipline and Discharge

Learn about key legal concepts and terms, and the role of stewards during an employer's investigation, when discipline is given, and during grievance meetings.

Representing Members in Front of Management

This module equips stewards to be proactive when meeting with management. Learn tips for effective meetings and building confidence by practicing meeting situations.

Growing our Mobilizing Power

Stewards can play a key role when the union needs to mobilize our members – whether it's to support the bargaining committee or stop the employer's attempt to contact our work. Learn basic mobilization theory and explore how stewards can tackle workplace problems in ways that engage more members and build the union's power.

<u>Pre-requisite:</u> In order to register, you need to have taken the Introduction to Stewarding workshop and have some practical experience as a steward.

In order to register, you <u>must</u> have completed the Introduction to Stewarding workshop. Delegates are expected to attend for the full duration of all the SLS modules, even if they have previously taken a module(s).

LEGAL, LEGISLATIVE AND HUMAN RIGHTS UPDATE

This course offers and opportunity to learn from and discuss with legal and human rights specialists. Participants will have the opportunity to hear details about important legal decisions, progress on legislative changes, and new frontiers in human rights.

Topics included in this session are:

- ◆ Leading cases, with a focus on new issues in duty to accommodate.
- Bargaining know-how in areas like bargaining beyond the gender binary.
- ◆ Bargaining for truth and reconciliation, exploring what decolonization language could include.
- ◆ Reviewing the 2013 Accessibility for Manitobans Act delving into what it was intended to accomplish, union and employer responsibilities, and where we are ten years out.





ADVANCED HEALTH AND SAFETY LEARNING SERIES

This Health and Safety Learning Series will give participants who have completed the Introduction to Health and Safety workshop a chance to explore advanced skills and knowledge to be successful while working on a health and safety committee or as a health and safety representative or advocate. Members will also learn how they can contribute to social justice causes while improving health and safety in the workplace.

This Winter School presents the following topics in health and safety:

Workload and Overwork

As employers pull back resources, they expect workers to do more with less. This module will examine workload, the cause and effects of overwork, and strategies to overcome the ever-increasing workload that is damaging not just our health at work, but the relationship we have outside of work.

Mobilizing Around Health and Safety

In this workshop, you will learn what mobilizing for health and safety looks like, how to engage members around health and safety in your workplace, and how to create a mobilizing plan.

Basics of Incident Investigations

Learn how to identify root causes of workplace incidents, injuries, and diseases, common routes of entry of toxic substances, and your role in the investigation process.

Identifying and Documenting Hazards

In this workshop, you will learn techniques for identifying hazards, such as body maps, surveys, and inspections. You will also develop a methodology for dealing with the hazards you find.
