54th Annual CUPE Summer School - Manitoba

Who Can Attend?

The School is open to all CUPE members sponsored by their Local.

The Weeklong Summer School provides a community atmosphere where learning, relaxation and fun are combined. The objective is to give CUPE members the opportunity to develop specialized skills in programs that are interesting and challenging.

Class size will be limited to approximately 20 participants. Participants will be registered on a first-come, first-served basis. Registration fees MUST be received by the registration deadline: May 17, 2024.

In order to provide the best learning environment, the CUPE Education Rep reserves the right to cancel any course if the registrations are low, or transfer participants to other courses.

The Education Rep also reserves the right to limit the number of members any one Local may send to any workshop.

Code of Conduct

All participants must follow the <u>CUPE Code</u> of <u>Conduct</u> and promote a high standard of trade union behaviour. Mutual respect will create safer union spaces for everyone. If incidents of harassment cannot be addressed through discussion between those involved, the Education Rep may assist. Locals will be advised of any serious concerns. Members, staff, elected officers, and guests must be mindful that all persons deserve dignity, equality and respect.

Bursaries

Two bursaries are available from CUPE Manitoba, as follows:

1. Small Local Bursary:

\$1,000 ➤ available to a small local or local in financial need. Where there is more than one local applying, priority will be given to locals most in need of financial assistance and/or to a local sending a participant who has not been to Summer School before.

2. Equity-Seeking Activist Bursary:

\$750 ➤ available to a member activist from an equity-seeking group. Please see the bursary descriptions page and application form in this brochure for the applicable criteria. Where there is more than one local applying, priority will be given to a member who has never been to Summer School, locals most in need of financial assistance, and activists who might otherwise not be able to attend.

A bursary application form is included in this package. A copy of your local's last Trustees' Report must accompany all bursary applications. The deadline for bursary applications is May 13, 2024.



2024 Summer School INFORMATION

Location

The Russell Inn & Conference Centre. Located on the Yellowhead Highway #16 at the junction of Highway #83 in the Town of Russell. The distance is about 340 km from Winnipeg, 180 km from Brandon, and 150 km from Dauphin.

Cost

2024 Summer School WORKSHOPS

Choose one course from the following four courses:

Health and Safety Mental and Social Health and Safety

Participants will explore mental health in the union, the workplace, and the community. We are pleased to offer **Mental Health First Aid Basic certification*** as part of this course. Other topics include healthy boundaries and addressing compassion fatigue for union activists, resources for supporting mental health care, trauma informed approaches, social determinant of mental health, and strategies for creating psychologically safer workplaces and safer union spaces.

* \$50 additional fee for materials (on top of registration fee).





Leadership Organizing for Power in the Union, the Workplace, and the Community

In this course, we will dig into campaign planning and strategy. We will develop strategies for fighting to win major bargaining, election and issues-based campaigns, develop plans for member engagement, explore the effective use of social media, try out brave conversations, work on turning grievances into direct action, and explore community-union solidarity work.





2024 Summer School WORKSHOPS (cont'd)

Communications Camp A to Z of Successful Union Communications

Union communications are changing at a rapid pace. Participants will build handson skills and knowledge for local website design and administration, and effective use of email and social media. Other topics include learning about literacy and plain language communications, exploring equity and inclusive language, and developing plans for member outreach, campaign and bargaining actions, and communicating tough issues.





Steward Learning Series Work Now, Grieve Later, Build Solidarity

This workshop will help union stewards develop and deepen skills for defending members' interest at work. Participants will delve into leading cases, learn skills for representing gender and sexually diverse members, explore safer spaces for Two-Spirit, trans, and non-binary workers, build workplace conflict skills, and try turning grievances into direct action.



2020 Summer School BURSARY DESCRIPTIONS

Two bursaries are available from CUPE Manitoba, as follows:

#1. Small Local / Local in Financial Need:

The first bursary in the amount of **\$1,000** is available to a small local or a local in financial need.

Where there is more than one local applying, priority will be given to locals most in need of financial assistance and/or to a local sending a member who has not been to Summer School before.

#2. Activist Member of an Equity-Seeking Group:

CUPE is committed to ensuring that our functions are accessible to members of diverse backgrounds. Therefore, the second bursary in the amount of **\$750** shall be awarded to an activist member of an equity-seeking group (women, racialized and Indigenous members, persons with disabilities, and LGBTTI members).

Where there is more than one local applying, priority will be given to a member who has never been to the Summer School, locals most in need of financial assistance, and activists who might otherwise not be able to attend.


