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55th Annual CUPE Summer School - Manitoba

Who Can Attend?

The School is open to all CUPE members sponsored by their Local.

This Weeklong Summer School provides a community atmosphere where learning, relaxation and fun are combined. The objective is to give CUPE members the opportunity to develop specialized skills in programs that are interesting and challenging.

Class size will be limited to approximately 20 participants. Participants will be registered on a first-come, first-served basis. Registration fees MUST be received by the registration deadline: June 3, 2025.

In order to provide the best learning environment, the CUPE Education Rep reserves the right to cancel any course if the registrations are low, or transfer participants to other courses.

The Education Rep also reserves the right to limit the number of members any one Local may send to any workshop.

Code of Conduct

All participants must follow the <u>CUPE Code of Conduct</u> and promote a high standard of trade union behaviour. Mutual respect will create safer union spaces for everyone. If incidents of harassment cannot be addressed through discussion between those involved, the Education Rep may assist. Locals will be advised of any serious concerns. Members, staff, elected officers, and guests must be mindful that all persons deserve dignity, equality and respect.

Bursaries

Two bursaries are available from CUPE Manitoba, as follows:

1. Small Local Bursary:

\$750 ➤ available to a small local or local in financial need. Where there is more than one local applying, priority will be given to locals most in need of financial assistance and/or to a local sending a participant who has not been to Summer School before.

2. Equity-Seeking Activist Bursary:

\$500 ➤ available to a member activist from an equity-seeking group. Please see the bursary descriptions page and application form in this brochure for the applicable criteria. Where there is more than one local applying, priority will be given to a member who has never been to Summer School, locals most in need of financial assistance, and activists who might otherwise not be able to attend.

A bursary application form is included in this package. A copy of your local's last Trustees' Report must accompany all bursary applications. The deadline for bursary applications is June 3, 2025.

2025 Summer School **WORKSHOPS**

Choose one course from the following four courses:

Health and Safety Mental Health at Work and in the Union

Participants will explore mental health in the union, the workplace, and the community. We are pleased to offer **Mental Health First Aid Basic certification*** as part of this course. Other topics include healthy boundaries, having difficult conversations, addressing compassion fatigue for union activists, social determinants of health, and skills-building for offering mental health supports to members.

* \$50 additional fee for materials (on top of registration fee).





Leadership Making Gains through Strategic Unionism

In this course, we will dig into union planning and strategy. We will develop strategies for fighting to win major bargaining, election and issues-based campaigns, as we explore methods that work for planning and implementing events, campaigns, and community-union solidarity work. Participants will build leadership skills for organizing members, lobbying governments and decision-makers, handling issues at the labour board, and building mutual support for union and community values and priorities.



2025 Summer School WORKSHOPS (cont'd)

Member Engagement for All Activating Your Local

How can we get members more involved in the union? How can we keep members engaged with union activities? Participants will build hands-on skills and plan for getting past member apathy to achieve active member engagement and mobilization. We will explore and develop plans for workplace mapping, systemic member outreach, building interest and commitment for campaign and bargaining actions, and build skills for handling complaints, conflicts and tough issues.





Steward Learning Series Work Now, Grieve Later, Build Solidarity

This workshop stream will help union stewards develop and deepen skills for defending members' interests at work. Participants will delve into leading cases, hone skills for building solidarity through grievance action, develop knowledge and skills for solidarity with Indigenous workers, work on representing members in disciplinary meetings and attendance management programs, learn new skills for handling human rights grievances, and develop skills for leading as team, handling tough grievances, and support members.

2025 Summer School BURSARY DESCRIPTIONS

Two bursaries are available from CUPE Manitoba, as follows:

#1. Small Local / Local in Financial Need:

The first bursary in the amount of \$750 is available to a small local or a local in financial need, based on the following financial criteria:

- Locals applying must be affiliated to CUPE Manitoba, with dues current to the end of the quarter prior to the event.
- Locals who have not received a bursary in the past and are in greatest financial need shall have first priority.
- Application for bursaries shall be made on a CUPE Manitoba Bursary Form.
- Where there is more than one local applying, priority will be given to locals most in need of financial assistance and/or to a local sending a member who has not been to Summer School before.

#2. Activist Member of an Equity-Seeking Group:

CUPE is committed to ensuring that our functions are accessible to members of diverse backgrounds. Therefore, the second bursary in the amount of \$500 shall be awarded to an activist member of an equity-seeking group (women in all their diversity, racialized and Indigenous members, persons with disabilities, 2SLGBTQI+ members, and young workers under the age of 35), based on the following criteria:

- Locals applying must be affiliated to CUPE Manitoba, with dues current to the end of the quarter prior to the event.
- Locals who have not received a bursary in the past and are in greatest financial need shall have first priority.
- Application for bursaries shall be made on a CUPE Manitoba Bursary Form.
- Where there is more than one local applying, priority will be given to a member who has never been to the Summer School, locals most in need of financial assistance, and activists who might otherwise not be able to attend.
- A bursary application form is included in this package.
- A copy of your local's last Trustees' Report **must** accompany all bursary applications.
- The deadline for all bursary applications is <u>June 3, 2025</u>.
