



WORKSHOP INFORMATION

Duty to Accommodate

Learn about the rights and responsibilities of both employers and unions under the Duty to Accommodate. In this workshop, you will:

- explore case law, key concepts and the prohibited grounds of discrimination under human rights law;
- learn to make the case for accommodating workers and how to help union representatives and employers come up with appropriate accommodations for members;
- look at how we can break down stereotypes and stigma to support the accommodation process for those who need
 it.

Health and Safety - An Introduction

This course serves as an introduction into the world of health and safety and explores different basic concepts such as:

- Identification of hazards;
- Hierarchy of controls;
- The basic role of health and safety committees;
- Basics on the right to refuse.

Introduction to Stewarding

What does CUPE steward do? If you are a new steward and want to learn how to help CUPE members solve workplace problems, this introductory workshop is for you!

In this workshop, you will learn:

- investigating workplace problems;

- meeting with management;
- dealing with workplace complaints.

Making Committees Work

This module explores the structure, role and function of health and safety committees, their strengths and limitations, and how they can best work within the legislative framework, and within our union.

LOCAL EXECUTIVE TRAINING

Bylaw Essentials

Good bylaws are an essential component of a well-functioning local. In this workshop, you will learn the principles of good bylaws and how to make sure they are in compliance with CUPE's National Constitution. We'll also look at how clear language bylaws help our members get involved in the work of the union.

Conflict-Ready Executives

In this workshop, participants will explore:

- The value of conflict for effective groups.
- How our beliefs about conflict shape how we respond.
- The kinds of conflict executives struggle with.
- Productive ways to resolve conflict on an executive.

Leading as a Team

In this workshop, executive teams explore power and responsibility that comes with it, how we work in teams and how to balance our leadership styles to engage the membership and work effectively across diversity.

Recording Secretaries

Recording Secretaries play a vital role in keeping local unions strong.

Learn how to:

- take clear and accurate meeting minutes;
- organize files;
- process and write correspondence; and
- communicate effectively with members.

NOTE: Please bring your local bylaws, sample meeting notices, sample membership meeting minutes, and a laptop or tablet (if you have one) to the workshop.

STEWARD LEARNING SERIES

Ally Skills for Stewards

Effective stewards are champions for human rights and equality. Explore what it means to be an ally, and ways that stewards can step up as allies in the workplace and the union.

Creating Harassment-Free Workplaces

Learn how to recognize harassment, educate members about harassment, and represent members who are involved in harassment complaints.

Duty of Fair Representation

Learn about where stewards get their authority in the workplace, the duty of fair representation, and other labour laws that cover the workplace.

Grievance Handling

Share tips and successful practices with other stewards and learn strategies for handling difficult grievances. NOTE: Please bring your Collective Agreement.

Handling Discipline and Discharge

Learn about key legal concepts and terms, and the role of stewards during an employer's investigation, when discipline is given, and during grievance meetings.

NOTE: Please bring your Collective Agreement.

Mediating Member-to-Member Conflict

Practice coaching members who are in conflict with other members, and work with a four-step approach to basic mediation.

Representing Gender and Sexually Diverse Members

Homophobia, biphobia, and transphobia play out in our workplaces, locals, and communities. Learn how to challenge these kinds of discrimination, and respectfully represent gender and sexually diverse members in your workplace.

Representing Members in Front of Management

This module equips stewards to be proactive when meeting with management. Learn tips for effective meetings, and build confidence by practicing meeting situations.

Understanding Mental Health

Explore the steward's role in supporting and representing members dealing with mental health issues. Learn how to challenge stigma, and how to approach a conversation with a member about a possible mental health issue.


- Registration is FREE for all workshop, unless otherwise specified.
